The colors in Spanish — point at the dot, say the word.

 rojo RRO-ho	red	 azul ah-SOOL	blue
 amarillo ah-ma-REE-sho	yellow	 verde VER-de	green
 naranja na-RAN-ha	orange	 violeta vee-o-LE-ta	purple
 rosa RRO-sa	pink	 marrón ma-RRON	brown
 negro NE-gro	black	 blanco BLAN-ko	white
 gris GREES	gray	 celeste se-LES-te	sky blue

Why celeste?

Sky blue gets its own word in Spanish — it's the color of the Argentine flag, so in Profé's house it comes up a lot.

That "sho" sound

In Argentine Spanish, // sounds like "sh": amarillo = ah-ma-REE-sho. It's the accent's signature — enjoy it.

Colors match their noun

Some colors change endings: un auto rojo, una casa roja. Don't drill it — just say it naturally and it sinks in.

Veo, veo... —¿Qué ves? ...¡Algo de color rojo!
